SPODDING FLOATERS

Spodding Sonubaits Oily Floaters can be a devastating method, especially if there is a wind in your face.

Although you can use any floating bait, the Sonubaits Oily Floaters give off a slick that draws fish to them.

By loading your spod and plugging the end with a fluffy groundbait mix such as S-Pellet Groundbait, you will maximize range and accuracy, and you won't lose any freebies on the cast.

Try to cast well past the fish. If possible it's better to cast from the next swim so you don't have to retrieve your spod over the feeding fish.

Keep the bait going in and you will be surprised how quickly the fish can show an interest and soon start to associate the sound of the spod hitting the water with food.
